Services

We offer services complementary to the NHS which support you and your baby to get off to the best start in life.

We are available to offer free support with your health needs, discuss how you feel about being pregnant and offer resources to help establish the bond between you and your baby as he/she grows inside you. We believe it is important to talk to your baby to enhance brain development and bonding. We can talk about feeding your baby and explain about getting your baby off to the best start in life and the importance of lots of cuddles and skin to skin contact when your baby is born. We can also signpost you to different services in your community, and compliment your midwife, obstetrician, health visitor and GP who provide main care for you and your baby antenatally, from birth and up to 5 years old. We are also available to offer the opportunity for you to explore the spiritual aspects of your health care, if you choose too.

As well as one-to-one support, we aim to develop community public health initiatives. For example, in 2016 we collaborated with St John's Angell Town Primary School to develop and pilot a baby friendly policy and curriculum.

N.B. We do not conduct any of your antenatal, intrapartum or postnatal care – you must have your own lead midwife/obstetrician.
